Definitions

Class

A Class may be set up if there are more than 6 regular Helms at the discretion of the committee.

Helm/Boat

In a Series each Boat will be counted as a different entry, unless sailing the same class of boat. Club boats used by different helms will be classed as a separate entry.

A boat with a choice of rig, e.g. a Laser, Vaneo, RS300, is counted as a separate class, except that a boat sailing with a smaller rig may be scored as the faster boat if it has been signed on as such.

Handicap System

The Portsmouth Yardstick, as notified by the RYA in document YR2, is used to determine corrected time.

The Committee reserves the right to use CN's (Club Numbers) as allowed by the Portsmouth Yardstick Scheme.

Club Numbers currently set are:

Personal Handicapping Systems may be introduced for future series.

To this end, Lap Times are to be recorded for all Handicap and Class Racing.

Average Lap Racing will be used for all club racing (even if in the same Class), except for pursuit races.

Race Duration for Fleet and Class Racing should be between 55 and 65 minutes in normal conditions for the first boat finished.

Any boat finishing more than 30 minutes after the leading boat in its fleet will be classified as DNF.

Scoring System

Abbreviations

DNC	Did not start; did not come to the starting area.
DNS	Did not start (other than DNC and OCS)
OCS	Did not start; On course side of starting line.
DNF	Did not finish.
RAF	Retired after finishing.
DSQ	Disqualification
DNE	Disqualification not discardable
RO	Race Officer (and Assistant Race Officer)
SBC	Safety Boat Crew
MKC	MK Cup and other absences authorised by the committee.
SUP	Bar and Galley Duty

Points

The RYA short series scoring will be used for 1-2 day events
DNC DNF OCS, DSQ, RAF DNE No. Boats in Series + 1
The RYA Long Series scoring system for longer events
DNC No. Boats in Series + 1
DNF OCS, DSQ, RAF DNE No. Boats in Race + 1

Unless stated otherwise the Number of Discards Allowed will be half the Number of Races Sailed (Rounded Up) less one.

To qualify for a series a helm must have competed in (Number Races of Races Sailed – Number of Discards Allowed).

i.e.

No. Races	1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12,
Discards	0, 0, 1, 1, 2, 2, 3, 3, 4, 4, 5, 5,
To Qualify	1, 2, 2, 3, 3, 4, 4, 5, 5, 6, 6, 7,

The Qualification Rules will not be applied until the end of the Series.

In a Series covering more than two days the RO's, SBC's, SUP's, MKC's will be given the average score of all races sailed by them other than DNC's in the series.

This will only apply to one Boat/Helm Combination.

A helm may not take more than two average point scores in a series, unless authorised by the committee.

Helms not "Signing On" may be classified as DNC by the RO

If there is an Overall Trophy for all classes in a series then there will be a single start.

Points are awarded using the Low Point System described in the RRS.

1st 1-point, 2nd 2-points, 3rd 3-points etc.

Series Ties are resolved using RYA Appendix rules

Aggregate points are the sum of points for two or more series.

Types of Race

- Handicap Race** Single Start, PN Ratings are used to calculate corrected time.
Corrected time = (Actual Time / (PH / 1000))
Average Lap times will be used for boats not completing the same number of laps.
With average lap racing being used the start and finish line must be in the same position.
- Class Racing** Each Class will be scored separately and will normally have its own start. The starts may be merged at the discretion of the Race officers, (but a separate line should be used if a class has 6 or more boats)
- Fleet Racing** The Helm/boats will be split into Gold/Silver/Bronze Fleets.
This will normally be a single start but may be split at the discretion of the RO. If there are 6 or more bronze Helms then there should be two starts.
The Fleets may also defined by Class for scoring purposes e.g. Laser, Wayfarer, G/H etc
- Pursuit** The Pursuit Race will be based on the time a Mirror should take to complete the race time. The duration will be between 90 and 240 minutes. The PH Rating is used to calculate the corrected start time to the nearest 30 secs, Rounded Down.
- Match/
Team Racing** This will always use boats of the same Class/Rig
- Gold Fleet**
1st Helm in any Series of more than three qualifying boats
1st Helm in any Pursuit race
1st Helm in any One Day Non-Team event
2nd Helm in any series of more than 4 qualifying boats
3rd Helm in any series of more than 6 qualifying boats
- Silver** Not in Gold or Bronze
- Bronze** Any Helm in 1st Year of Racing at any club.

New Members and infrequent sailors will be categorised according to their experience at the discretion of the Rear Commodore/ Results Secretary
Appeals can be made to the Sailing Committee.
- Fleet
Adjustment** Two Helms will be changed to a different fleet at the end of any of the long series other than between an aggregate Fleet Series.
- Personal
Handicap** Expressed as a percentage and would be calculated from actual performance in handicap races. It will be applied to any boat sailed by that helm. The mechanism for calculating Personal Handicaps will be published when required.
- Trophies**
A 1st Position will be awarded if one boat qualifies for a series
A 2nd Position will be awarded if two boats qualify for a series
A 3rd Position will be awarded if three boats qualify for a series

- Rank Xerox** Team Handicap Event, Early September
11.30, 13.30 and 15.00 starts
1st Race Qualifying Race, 1 Discard Allowed from Races 2 & 3.
The same Helm must start all three races to Qualify for the Trophy.
Teams to consist of 1st and last, 2nd and penultimate etc
In the event of there being an un-partnered boat a team of three will be formed.
Helms that are not available for all three races must not sign on for this event.
- Trafalgar Trophy** Mid October
240 minute Pursuit Race
- Barclays Bucket** 11.30 General Handicap Race (Morning). Run on the Day Daylight Saving starts.
- Lottery Pot** 13.30 120 Min Pursuit Race. Run in the afternoon after the Barclays Bucket.
- Other Awards**
- Chile Plate** A Charity Event To be run in conjunction with any of the summer or autumn series
May be sailed more than once per year.
- Chaton Trophy** A Discretionary Trophy Awarded to the member who has given rise to the "Most Schadenfreude". Speech is mandatory.
- William Lyman** A Discretionary trophy awarded to the most improved Senior Helm. Awarded by the committee.
- Phil Lyon** A Discretionary trophy awarded to the most improved Junior Helm. Awarded by the committee.
- Denbigh Cup** Single General Handicap Race for juniors, run in conjunction with an 11.30am race in September.
- RNLI Pennant** A Charity event to be run in conjunction with any of the Spring/Summer Events
- Civil Service Cup** Bronze in Spring/Summer Series
- Cahoot Trophy** Silver in Spring/Summer Series
